Enriching Your Child's Vocabulary

At our recent English Open Morning, some parents gave good suggestions on how they help their child at home in enriching their vocabulary at home. Here are some of the parents ideas:

- Reading lots of different stories and non-fiction books, writing stories at home, talking about lots of different subjects
- Encouraging them to use a greater variety of words
- Get child to pick something they can see in surroundings and get them to describe it
- Talking with children is the key – learning to discuss
- Word of the day competition to see who can use the word the most during the day
- Playing 20 questions and I spy
- Lots of reading, talking, playing games like Guess Who, which is good for adjectives
- Modelling good vocabulary in family conversations
- Playing memory board game with things that start with the same letter
- Write the new vocabulary from a story book on a board and then try and use it in a family discussion
- Just talk about anything and everything! Discussing books, finding words in the environment
- Story cards and story dice. Spelling sentences incorporating different words

Parental Questionnaire and Parent Forum

We were delighted to receive 116 Parental Ofsted responses and feel this gives us a good evidence base to say that generally parents are pleased with our school.

Over the next couple of terms, I will be explaining some of the reasons behind what we do in an effort to ensure that every parent is happy. This week I hope to persuade the two parents who did not feel that expectations were high enough for their child and inform the eight that did not know if expectations were high enough for their child that expectations are high for all pupils. As the questionnaire was anonymous I would also like to invite those two parents to make an appointment to speak to their class and share their concerns.

A good school must have high expectations for all pupils and urge children to achieve the most they can whatever their starting point. We hope that by having high expectations pupils will work as hard as they can and will enjoy the learning. We are very aware of the balancing act between high expectations and encouragement and too much pushing that leaves pupils anxious and demoralised. We aim that every day we help our pupils achieve and those that are struggling to catch up. We believe we encourage and reassure our children and give them the self-belief that they can achieve. We are aware that not all children enjoy every subject but we hope that your child enjoys most of what we do. We have noticed that children work hard when there is a purpose to the learning and if they are rewarded. This is where you can help by praising your child's efforts. We know that children who have succeeded in one lesson will be more positive about future lessons and can also cope better with short periods of difficulty. For children who are not achieving we give them hope that, with support, they will achieve and we then praise their efforts.

We are very mindful of the national expectations for an infant child and work hard to ensure that we reach and exceed these. Over time we continue to succeed higher than nationally in our assessments and believe we give our children a good start to their early education. We are confident in our subject knowledge and know how young children learn best. We join you in wanting the very best for every child. If you still feel that your expectations for your child and ours are different please let your class teacher know at the parent interviews that are coming up shortly.

On 26th February at 2.15pm we are holding a Parents Forum. This is an opportunity for parents to come along and share their views on a variety of topics.

On this occasion, we will be focusing on the following areas; some of which came out of our recent Parent Ofsted Questionnaire:

- There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school (2 parents concerned, 4 did not know)
- The school has high expectations for my child (4 parents concerned, 7 did not know)
- When I have raised concerns they have been dealt with properly (4 parents concerned)
- The school supports my child's wider development (1 parent concerned, 11 did not know)

We will also be starting to discuss a new policy on Relationships and Sex Education which will be introduced in September 2020.

We would welcome as many parents to join us as possible. If you are able to attend, please let a member of the school office staff know.
